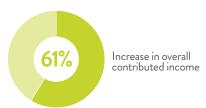

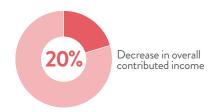
The Advisory Board for the Arts regularly surveys leaders at arts organizations — including operas, ballets, symphonies, festivals, theaters, venues, schools, advocacy organizations, and museums — about issues relevant to the arts world. This online survey was fielded **November 18–24, 2021**. This is the fourtieth survey of the series and was designed to help arts leaders benchmark the state of fundraising efforts and sources of contributed income in this season of reopening.

Overall Contributed Income This Fiscal Year/Calendar Year vs. Last Year





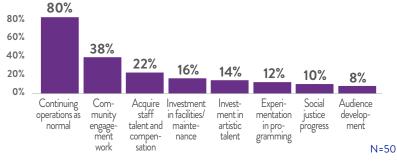

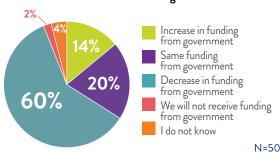
Majority of Government Funding Goes Towards General Operations

Change in Government Funding Over the Next 3 Years as Part of Overall Giving Portfolio

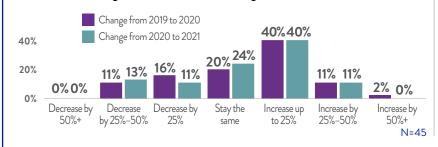

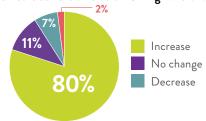
Consistent Trend of Slight Increase in Individual Donors Across the Last 2 Years

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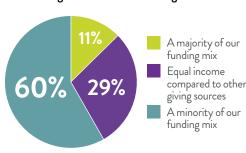

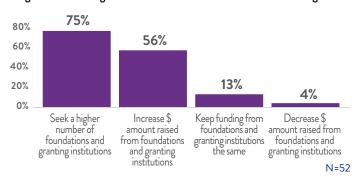
F&GI Giving Typically is an Equal or Minor Source of Overall Fundraising

Arts Leaders Agree to Increasing Their Activity with F&GIs in the Near Future

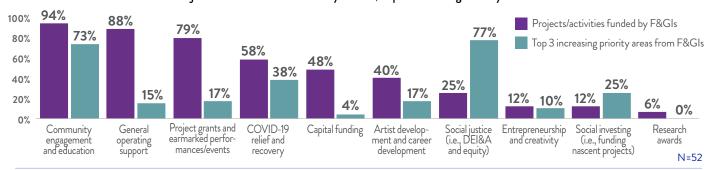
Change in F&GI Giving Over the Next 3 Years as Part of Overall Giving Portfolio



Most F&GI Gifts Fund Community Work and General Operations Increasing Priority in Social Justice from F&GIs

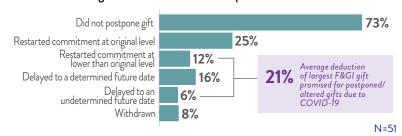
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Historical Projects and Activities Funded by F&GIs; Top 3 Increasing Priority Areas From F&GIs



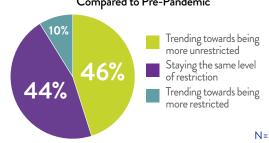
A Handful Experienced a Postponement/Alteration of F&GI Gifts, 21% Avg. Deduction of Original Gift
